STATEWIDE MEETING A HUGE SUCCESS: Fifty VHS members and friends assembled at Chesterfield C.H., Va. 9 miles south of the state capital for the first annual meeting of this Society. Delegates came from as far away as Bedford, Bridgewater and Norfolk. A strong delegation came from the Virginia and Maryland suburbs of Washington, D.C. Messages from many other members expressed regret at being unable to attend.

Virginia varieties and out-of-state reptiles and amphibians were on exhibit. The cover was provided by a sunny pavilion with a large fire-place at each end. Tables were arranged in an open "U". From this base sorties were made into the surrounding woodland. Many varieties of Reptiles and Amphibians were seen and taken alive during the day. The Society's president, Dr. John T. Wood, of Burkeville, brought in 2 Copperheads (Agkistrodon contortrix mokeson). Several species of salamanders, lizards and snakes were seen and recorded. Swapping of specimens left the younger set a bit puzzled over what they had and had not. Anyone knowing the present location of three King Snakes (Lampropeltis getulus (sp)?) which escaped from a jar with a loosened lid -- please write c/o the Secretary.
