THE SNAKES OF VIRGINIA

In order to get even a very general idea of the distribution of Virginia forms, checks were made in a number of collections. The data have been placed on a series of large state maps. These are to be used both by VHS members and interested herpetologists.

The accompanying pages are to show just how little is really known concerning the distribution of Virginian snakes. Later lists on the other reptiles and the amphibians will show even less knowledge of the extent of these forms.

VHS may not identify the sources of all of its data without advance approval or knowledge of those who have contributed data based upon a private collection. Communicate with the VHS Secretary on matters relating to location of specimens.

If you know of records in other collections, private or otherwise, please drop a note to VHS telling where these specimens may be seen and providing any data which may be in your possession.

It is the hope of the author that the data will be greatly improved over the next few years by careful collecting and record-keeping.

NOTES ON THE DISTRIBUTION AND IDENTIFICATION OF THE SNAKES OF VIRGINIA...

"Modern taxonomists deal in the identification of populations rather than of individuals. though a person may have but one specimen it is considered asample of a population which is improved as other specimens become available. A person, therefore, never identifies one specimen from any given area as one subspecies, and another specimen from the same area as belonging to another subspecies. Instead, when a population includes a mixture of individuals -- some of which look like one subspecies and some exhibiting traits of another subspecies ---the population as a whole is then labeled an intergrade population. This is a keystone of modern taxonomy."

These words of advice from a friend and student of Virginian herpetofauna make a great deal of sense when you consider specimens of the various milk snakes taken in Virginia. There is little or no doubt that many specimens are intergrades between the Eastern Milk Snake of the highlands and the Coastal Plain Milk Snake. A bit further south -- in Tidewater -- the intergradation occurs with the Scarlet King Snake. It is unlikely that really typical specimens of Lampropeltis d. doliata are to be found in Virginia. The population in the southeastern Va. counties, known from several specimens, is most likely intergraded with the Coastal Plain Milk Snake. More specimens are needed.

TYPE SVENIE BY STRIVE

Color Cover: Shows the Scarlet Snake which strongly resembles the Coastal Plain Milk Snake and Scarlet King Snake but which has a pure white belly.

The Coastal Plain Milk Snake illustrated here shows some traits not unmindful of the Eastern Milk Snake (L. d. triangulum). All sorts of intergradations between the Coastal Plain specimens and the Scarlet King Snake occur in the state and warrant a special study.

Fortunately, the venomous Coral Snake (Micrurus fulvius) is not found in the state.

EASTERN DIAMONDBACK RATTLESNAKES have not been found in the Great Dismal Swamp, Va., where they may find a more suitable environment. The nearest capture, historically, was at Jackson, North Carolina, 10 to 15 miles south of the N.C.-Va. state line.

The species has been observed in Dickenson County in the southwestern highlands of Virginia well out of its normal coastal habitat and range. This species is believed to have been released by members of a religious group who handled poisonous snakes as a demonstration of their faith in God during religious services. The Diamondback, and perhaps other exotic (non-native) species may occur in SW highland counties.

NOTES ON VIRGINIAN SNAKES (concluded)

Excellent black and white drawings of the Copperhead, Rattler, and Eastern Cottonmouth appeared in the May, 1964, VIRGINIA WILDLIFE, inside the back cover.

UNUSUAL or RARE SNAKES should be saved, alive if possible in a secure container out of the sunlight and with ventilation and provision for water. If the snake is dead, preserve in a 40% formalin solution which your local registered drugist can provide without physician's prescription. Formalin is a poison so keep out of the reach of small children. Write VHS Secretary for a copy of VHS Bulletin No. 11 on Preserving Specimens and Developing Collections by J.T. Wood, MD, first president of VHS (1958-1959).

COLOR PHOTOGRAPHY should not be neglected. Preservation of rare specimens in any preservative solution brings about color changes. Take a color portrait, preferably a 2" X 2" color slide.
